Mission: The mission of the Access and Collective Engagement Committee is to support the Foundation leadership, committees, and staff in implementing and accomplishing the Foundation's initiatives toward being inclusive and accessible to our diverse stakeholders.

Goals and Objectives: The initial goals of the Access and Collective Engagement Committee are listed below. The committee, NATA Foundation President, Executive Committee and Board will re-evaluate the goals at least annually and adjust, as needed.

1. Facilitate educational programming for Foundation Board Members, Committee Chairs and Volunteers that is aligned and integrated with the educational requirements of our Strategic Alliance partners. This will include education and on-boarding of volunteers, collaboration with Strategic Alliance partners, and evaluation of gaps related to engagement and accessibility for diverse populations.
2. Address barriers to access and engagement within the Foundation's programs to close gaps and implement best practices where needed.
3. Track metrics to measure the Foundation's progress and outcomes related to access and engagement objectives, action items, and policies that are adopted by the Foundation Board.
4. Assist the Foundation staff and leadership, as needed, in developing and reviewing communication related to access and engagement.

5. Serve as a resource on engagement and access to Foundation Committee Chairs, Board Members, and Staff in relation to the implementation of policies, initiatives, and measures to evaluate program effectiveness.
